

World Maths Day is one of the world's largest global educational events. Taking place on the 5th May 2021, this day aims to get pupils excited and enthusiastic about learning maths!

World Maths Day was created by Australian digital learning resource developer 3P Learning in 2007. The first World Maths Day was held on 5th May (3.14, or "Pi Day") of that year, and almost 300,000 students from 98 different countries participated in online competitive games centred around mental maths problems.

At D'Eyncourt we will be celebrating this day by hosting a number of exciting mathematical activities. There will be no donation for this event and children will wear their uniform as normal.
