Happy New Year to you all and welcome back to school. It was lovely to see everyone again to start the new year. We hope that you all enjoyed the Christmas break and were able to spend some quality time with your loved ones. We hope you managed to see the videos of the Christmas performances with your wider family. The performances were excellent and highlighted how important music and performance is for our children - we were so glad to invite some parents/carers in to see the shows in person.

On behalf of all staff, a huge 'Thank You' to the children and parents who brought Christmas cards and gifts at the end of last term. We all really appreciate your thoughtfulness and generosity, especially at such a busy and costly time of year.

I'm sure that you will be aware of the constantly changing Government guidance regarding COVID-19. I sent a Dojo post last week detailing the up-to-date requirements and changes with the isolation period. This is now 7 days from the point of symptoms or from the date of positive test if asymptomatic, on condition of two negative lateral flow tests undertaken on days 6 and day 7 at least 24 hours apart.

The deadline for making your application for a Reception place for September 2022 is Saturday 15 January 2022. We strongly advise you to list several schools on your application, ranked in order of your preference.

This week, we have had a busy week with Year 5 and 6 children receiving digital ambassador training with Wider Learning. The children have been working hard to learn all about online safety and they want to share their knowledge with the rest of the school. Mr Taylor is working with the children so keep a look out on Class Dojo for updates!

At the start of this new year a reminder please of our expectations with regard to school uniform; all of our children are expected to wear school uniform to school every day. This includes black school shoes; trainers are not permitted unless in exceptional circumstances. Any hair accessories should be discreet, not brightly coloured and jewellery should not be worn with the exception of small studded earrings which should be removed for PE lessons. Please see the policy on Class Dojo for more details. Thank you for your help and support in reinforcing these regulations with your children.

Energy Saving Week

Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.
