

Earth Day

Today, we have been celebrating Earth day and focusing upon climate change. We have been looking at the importance of trees to try and help to combat the problem of climate change.

Reception have been looking at the variety of trees we have on our school ground and identifying them. They have been discussing the effects of climate change in class/

Year 1/2 have been looking at the variety and number of trees we have on our school grounds and looking at the benefits of trees and how they protect the environment. Today, they have been making posters about the importance of trees to the planet.

Year 3/4 have looked at the problems and impact of deforestation and what can be done about this. They have discussed rainforests and how rainforests are endangered.

Year 5/6 have been looking at Greta Tunberg and watched her speech about climate change. They have been inspired to write their own speeches.
