<u>Year 5 Visit to Heath</u> <u>Park</u>



<u>Uniform</u>

<u>Swimming Next Year</u>

We are pleased to announce that we are extending our swimming provision from September so that Year 3/4 classes will be spending a term each attending swimming lessons on a Monday afternoon as well as Year 5/6. The National Curriculum aims for all Year 6 children to be able to swim 25m upon leaving their primary education.

As we have done this year, next year we will continue to let children wear their PE kit on the day that they have PE. They will be asked to attend school in their games kit on their swimming day. The timetable is as follows:

3/4B Mrs Bowater's Class - September until Christmas.

3/4RB Mr Brazier's Class - January until Easter.

3/4C Mrs Claybrooke's Class - April until July.

Remember that Wolverhampton Council offers free swimming to children who are over 8 years old, should you be able to have a few practice sessions in the holidays. A permission letter will be sent out to each class prior to our sessions beginning for you to sign.
