D'Eyncourt Primary School Change of Age Range Consultation FAQs

Q. Why is this consultation taking place?

A. D'Eyncourt Primary School is working with the school governors and Trust to increase pupils numbers. This consultation is part of a statutory process for making prescribed alterations to schools, including changing the age range of a community school by moving to ages 3-11 from 4-11.

Q. Who decides whether the change goes ahead?

A. Following the period of consultation, the Central Learning Partnership Trust will review the feedback and decide on whether or not to go ahead with the changes.

Q. Where does the funding for the change come from?

A. School will use existing funds with the support of Central Learning Partnership to implement a nursery. School will receive an increase in funding due to the increase in pupil numbers.

Q. What will be the effect on other educational establishments in the area?

A. There is not anticipated to be a significant impact on other local educational establishments in the area due to no increase in places from those that are currently offered and to the need to provide additional places to meet the requirements of working parents.

Q. When will the changes be carried out?

A. A decision will be made so that any changes can be completed ready for September 2024.

Q. Will there be any changes to the way the school is managed?

A. There will be no changes to the school's operation as a result of the age range change – both school and nursery will continue to be governed by the same board and led by the same head teacher.

Q. Will there be any changes to the school's admission arrangements as a result of the change in age range?

A. The school's existing admission arrangements will remain the same for reception – year 6 however a new admission arrangement will be made for nursery places. Admission will be completed directly through school.
