Nursery Consultation

You may have seen on Dojo the information regarding the proposed establishment of a nursery at D'Eyncourt Primary School. In order to establish a nursery, it is necessary for the Trust to change the age range for which the school can cater for, from 4-11 to 3-11 years old. This would enable the school to offer nursery provision to children aged 3 and 4 years. Central Learning Partnership Trust seek to open a 10-place nursery at D'Eyncourt Primary School with effect from September 2024. Currently, children who join D'Eyncourt Primary School at the age of four, come from a variety of settings within the locality. Under the new proposals, children aged three upwards would be able to formally attend the school. The nursery would operate from the existing accommodation on the school site, sharing the space currently used for Reception children.
