









**"SUPER HOMEWORK!"

If you make a real birthday cake take a photograph of the end result and bring this in as your homework. If you choose to make a pretend birthday cake you can bring this into school with you. You can use anything you want to create your dream birthday cake. Encourage your child to say: "This is my dream birthday cake because..." "I have used..."
